(Minimum 500 words. Maximum 1000 words)

- 1) First, tell us the province, city and/or town in Italy your family is from and what you know about your Italian ancestry and their immigration story, going as far back as you can.
- 2) Tell us about your participation in Italian cultural events. For example, attending Italian feasts in local communities, attending the Columbus Day Parade in NYC or in local communities. You can also include your Italian in-school and after school/weekend activities or anything you do that is traditionally Italian.
- 3) Share with us your fondest memories and stories of growing up with Italian traditions handed down by your Italian or Italian-American parent(s) and grandparent(s).
- 4) Tell us about an Italian-American you admire . This person can be a historical or currently relevant Italian-American. Tell us about their accomplishments and why this person has earned your respect and admiration.
- 5) If you are studying the Italian language, tell us if and how you can practice what you're learning. For example, any Italian-speaking relatives or friends who are helping you become more conversational.
- 6) In closing, tell us what being an Italian-American means to you and what values pertaining to Italian culture you have learned from your parents as well as from other Italian friends/relatives. Let us know how you plan to incorporate what you've learned into your adult lives.

Note: For students who have traveled to Italy, please tell us about your experience and if applicable, any relatives you may have there whom you visited and remain in touch with, and how you communicate with them-- Facebook etc.

Please note: Never having been to Italy does not reduce your chance of being chosen for this scholarship!

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS:

1) Attach completed application (pages 1 and 2) and your essay, along with any photos of yourself with family, classmates, and friends at local Italian-American community events (example: Columbus Day Parade, Feast of San Gennaro), photos of family trips to Italy, or doing anything traditionally Italian: for example, making pizza or sauce together.

On your email cover page, be sure to number the photos and include a brief description of the Italian event and who appears in the photos with you.

2) After final exams, all applicants are required to send us, in a separate email, a copy of your final grades/transcripts from sophomore and junior years.
